#### What Should I Do if I have a Positive NAT Result?

#### Step 1: Stay Calm

- Discovering you have a positive NAT result can undoubtedly be a confusing and anxiety provoking moment. If you find yourself in this situation, take a deep breath and begin by focusing on what is within your control at this moment.
- Please contact your Consulate right away (see below). A representative from the Consulate will then help you to report the case to the neighborhood committees. Meanwhile, wait at home.
- Medics will come to arrange a nucleic acid testing. Seal the used test kit in the plastic bag and hand it to the medics when they arrive.
- You will remain at home until the nucleic acid testing result comes back. The current expectation of PCR test result is around 24-48 hrs.
- The CDC representative will inform you if you have tested positive and, if so, you will need to prepare your items as you will likely be transported to a centralized quarantine location. Although there are now cases where expats have been quarantined at home or in a hotel and you should ask for this to happen.
- At present, there may likely be a 12-72-hours wait period between the time you have received a call from CDC and the time you are picked up and transported to centralized quarantine.

Step 2: Contact the Human Resources department of your workplace (they may well have more agency that an individual in this situation)

#### Step 3: Contact your Consulate / Embassy

• Foreigners in Shanghai should contact their Consulate in Shanghai or embassy (in Beijing) either via email or phone, and report that they have tested positive for COVID-19. When connecting with your consulate ensure that you have provided your address in Shanghai, your passport number, your mobile phone number, as well as your emergency contact information (contact information of a family member or friend). If you have family members, ensure their information is provided as well.

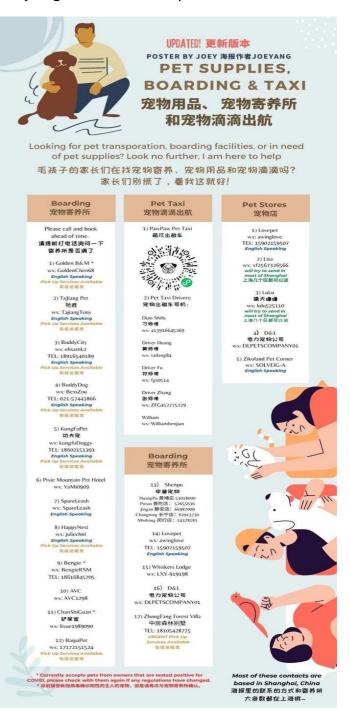

#### Step 4: For those with pets - Contact your Designated Pet Caregiver

- If you have a pet (or several) connect with your designated pet caregiver and do your utmost to have your pet(s) picked up prior to the arrival of the CDC.
- Ensure your pet caregiver has the necessary documentation and supplies that your pet(s) will need for a period of 2-3 weeks. The following resources provide a good overview of how to ensure your pet(s) are cared for in the event you go to centralized quarantine.





### Step 5: Begin to prepare for centralized quarantine

It is likely you will not be provided with information on your centralized quarantine location, as well as the conditions of the site. Below is a list of items to consider, though the suggestion has been conveyed to pack as light as you are able to, given the potential of transferring locations, pack what you feel will support you the best during your quarantine period.

<ul> <li>□ Passports, or any other identity documents</li> <li>□ Mobile phone</li> <li>□ Charging cables (and maybe a power strip for simultaneous device charging)</li> </ul>					
Food					
You will most likely receive three meals each day; however, the quality and the meals will vary. Be prepared that you will probably not have access to deliveries or take away food.					
Fiber from fresh fruit and vegetables may be limited, and refrigeration options aren't guaranteed.					
Below is a list of food to consider bringing if you can:					
<ul> <li>□ Fresh fruits if you have any on hand</li> <li>□ Dried fruits</li> <li>□ Instant noodles</li> <li>□ Crackers, wraps, spreads</li> <li>□ Coffee / tea</li> <li>□ Powdered or UHT Milk</li> <li>□ Cereal / protein bars</li> <li>□ Canned items. Don't forget the can opener.</li> <li>□ Bag clips, Ziploc bags, or rubber band to seal opened food.</li> <li>□ Anything you can add to rice! Salt and pepper, sauces, dried herbs.</li> </ul>					
Daily Necessities					
These things can help you feel more in control of your space, and help you manage your environment. There won't be cleaning services or other amenities available.					
<ul> <li>□ Cutlery per person, spoon, fork, etc.</li> <li>□ Cups and/or a travel mug with a lid is ideal for confined spaces as accidents happen and cleanup is difficult.</li> <li>□ Blankets and additional sheets for each bed</li> </ul>					
☐ Body-size towel, face towel, bathmat although depending on where you are there may or may not be a shower.					

<ul> <li>□ Tea kettle (usually provided, but may be small or dirty)</li> <li>□ Tissues, and 2 rolls of toilet paper this may or may not be provided</li> <li>□ Eye mask and earplugs (depending on confinement environment)</li> </ul>				
Personal Toiletries				
You will likely be given a few small toiletries at the centralized quarantine site. However, it is best to pack your desired personal toiletries to ensure you have what you need.				
<ul> <li>□ Hair/body care products (Shampoo / Conditioner)</li> <li>□ Toothbrush / paste</li> <li>□ Moisturizer / Lotion</li> <li>□ Vitamins (C and D)</li> <li>□ Prescription Medications</li> <li>□ Personal first aid, band aids, antiseptic etc., electrolytes □ Feminine hygiene products</li> </ul>				
Clothes				
Keep it simple, and comfortable. Pack light and warm.				
<ul><li>☐ Flip flops / slippers</li><li>☐ Change of Clothing (Underwear, socks, etc.)</li><li>☐ Pajamas</li></ul>				
Keeping Entertained				
It's going to be different for us all, so here are some suggestions.				
<ul> <li>□ Laptops and HDMI cable</li> <li>□ iPhone or tablet holder</li> <li>□ Headphones (noise cancelling can be a real benefit)</li> </ul>				
Items to consider for children:				
<ul> <li>□ A stuffed toy</li> <li>□ Family pictures</li> <li>□ Books and/or magazines</li> <li>□ Board games, cards, puzzles (a mat to roll it away, it will be a small space)</li> <li>□ Stationary, paper, colorful tape, glue, markers, string, balloons- supplies that can be used to make an obstacle course or play activities</li> <li>□ Stickers, legos, coloring books, favorite toys to keep busy</li> <li>□ Small balls, small racquets, Velcro dartboard, small balls</li> </ul>				

# Step 6: Double check you have everything that you need and try to relax as you wait for the CDC to arrive.

- Given that you may have a 12-72-hour period between when the CDC will arrive to transport you to centralized quarantine, we want to ensure you are packed with all the items you will need.
- Once you have completed packing, try to rest, and relax as much as possible and mentally prepare for the journey ahead.
- Assuming your preference is to request remaining in your own home, we suggest you
  download (save as to your desktop) and fill out, or print and fill out this letter:

#### Step 7: Once the CDC has arrived

While we suggest you comply with your neighborhood committee and health authorities, we suggest you request to stay at home for your quarantine period, if possible. To do so, we have outlined the following steps:

- If asked by the health authorities to move to centralized quarantine, present them with your Home Ouarantine Commitment Letter (as explained in Step 6 above).
- You will likely need to assuage them of concerns regarding your living conditions, these suggestions may support your effort:
- You have access to a private bathroom that will not be shared with others in your household.
   You have food and can support additional orders for food.
- You have basic medical necessities
- You will not turn on your AC or Heat systems throughout the quarantine period

While we cannot say this will work in all cases, we hope, alongside the effort of your Consulate, that it may support your effort to remain in your home for quarantine.

#### **Step 8: Connect with Others**

- During this period, it is essential that you connect with individuals who will provide you with words of reassurance, encouragement, and ongoing support.
- Tens of thousands of individuals are currently in centralized quarantine in Shanghai and connecting with others to share experiences will reaffirm the fact that you are not alone in this process, as scary as it may be.
